High School students co-enrolling for first time need to complete and bring to co-enrollment a Parent Statement of Understanding Form. Forms may be picked up in the Student Service's office or the Tech Prep Coordinator's office.

High School Students and Adult Students:

New Alliance guidelines provide the opportunity for students to receive college credit simultaneously in approved programs while attending Northeast Technology Center. This is a new opportunity for high school students! Below you will find the criteria that must be met before earning college credit at a participating college.

High School students must meet **one** of the following criteria while at NTC:

1. A cumulative grade point average of 2.5; or
2. A composite score of 15 on the Plan Test taken during the sophomore year; or
3. A composite ACT score of 19.

High School Students:

1. Enroll in a technical program with an Alliance Agreement;
2. Be a Junior or Senior;
3. Complete a Parent Statement of Understanding form;
4. Submit a Cooperative Alliance Co-Enrollment form to the college after the above stated items are met.

Adult Students:

1. Enroll in a technical program with an Alliance Agreement;
2. Submit a Cooperative Alliance Co-Enrollment form to the college.

Costs and Fee Waiver:

College tuition is waived, but there will be an \$8.00 per credit hour fee assessed for the college credit that will be granted by the participating college. Students will be invoiced directly from the college and it will be the student's responsibility to pay this fee to the college. Fees can be waived for High School students if ACT Fee Waiver documentation is provided to NTC. Adult students can use Financial Aid refund to pay co-enrollment fees.
